Much like the existing mandatory requirement for employers with 250 or more employees must publish their gender pay gap. We call upon the government to introduce the ethnicity pay gap reporting. To shine a light on race / ethnicity based inequality in the workplace so that they can be addressed. The response was posted yesterday and explains a decision will be reached before the end of the year. The petition can also still be signed until September.
