University Travel Survey results

Thank you to all colleagues who completed the recent travel survey that was open to all staff and students. Your responses have provided valuable information and feedback about commuting behaviour, and perceptions of sustainable travel options. Results indicate that measures introduced through the Sustainable Travel Plan have been successful in encouraging staff and students to commute by more sustainable methods in comparison to 2008, and that the University is on track to achieve a 5% reduction in single occupancy car journeys. Birmingham tunnel closures 19 July–2 September

A <u>website</u> has been launched to help commuters plan ahead for closures of A38 tunnels this summer. The site provides an overview of works, plus advice on routes and transport into the city centre. St Chad's and Queensway tunnels will be closed to all traffic from 19 July to 2 September.
