Date 4 November - 1 December

Have Your Say 2013 is the University's third all-staff survey and is an important and effective way to gather the views of colleagues across the University. As a result of the last survey, action plans and developments at local and University-wide levels were taken forward based directly on feedback from staff. Over 66 per cent of University staff completed Have Your Say 2011; well above the benchmark for similar higher education institutions and 10 per cent above the participation rate in 2009. We hope that this year we will achieve an even higher participation rate to measure staff engagement even more accurately. # University to host LGBT History Month launch

On 28 November the Bramall Music Building will play host to the national pre-launch event for LGBT History Month 2014 with a celebration on the theme of 'music'. The Athena SWAN Charter promotes greater representation of women in STEMM, particularly at senior level.
