

Updates to University Legislation for the 2023-24 cohort.

This note includes information regarding updates to academic and student University Legislation (i.e. Regulations, Codes of Practice, Policies and Guidance), which were approved by the relevant University Committee.

It shows updates that were made prior to the publication of the 2023-24 cohort legislation, and, retrospective updates that were made following the publication of the 2023-24 cohort legislation. [NB: in line with CMA guidance, all 2023-24 cohort legislation documents were published on 16th December 2022].

If a piece of University Legislation is not listed then please assume it was rolled forward between years (i.e. no updates were made).

1. Home Office (UK Visas and Immigration [UKVI]) Required Amendments

- a. In late 2022, the Home Office (UK Visas and Immigration [UKVI]) provided universities with updated details about what they are required to do / undertake to continue to meet their sponsor licence duties. The Home Office's clear expectation is that all delivery to international taught or research student visa holders is required to take place on campus, with no online activity or online delivery allowed. These amends to UKVI regulations also required consideration around dissertations periods, examination periods and sabbatical officer periods. The below updates have all been made as part of this process (i.e. they were required to ensure the University continues to adhere to its duties).

 - A footnote has been added to the header of section 6.1. This has been added for clarity, to note that UoB use the term "programme" and "course" interchangeably.

In addition, language has been updated to ensure in keeping with current terminologies and the external policy landscape. None of the updates made are deemed to be detrimental, the updated document is more supportive, with the process enhanced.

- A full review of this document has been conducted by Senior colleagues, with input from Students, on behalf of the University Education Committee (UEC). Various updates have been made throughout, with main ones noted as:
 - An updated summary of the lecture capture system available for use across the University (section 2).
 - Archiving of recording retention period has been updated to consider data retention legislation (section 4).
 - The University maintains an opt out form for lecture participants who wish to be edited or removed from any recording data (section 4).
 - The University's current 'opt in' policy for lecture capture will continue and therefore academic colleagues wishing to 'opt out' of lecture recording are required to provide acceptable alternative resources (section 5).
 - Appendix 1 has been removed as it now out of date.
 - The University will maintain the existing Event Capture Audience/Guest Speaker (External) Consent Form and Licence process (appendix 2).
